AUTHORIZING ATTENDANCE IN THE 3RD NATIONAL

CONVENTION OF THE CAREER EXECUTIVE SERVICE OFFICIALS

AND CAREER SERVICE EXECUTIVE ELIGIBLES

The National Council of Career Executive Service Organizations Inc., (NCCESO) in partnership with the Executive Leadership Program Alumni Association, Inc. (ELP-AA) through the Career Executive Service Board (CESB) will hold a national convention with the theme, "Enhancing Effectiveness, Efficiency and Accountability in Governance Towards a Dynamic 21st Century." The convention gathers together managers of government agencies and instrumentalities in an occasion for recognizing good governance initiatives nationwide, renewing their commitment towards public service excellence and establishing an agenda for a more transparent and accountable bureaucracy.

Slated on 23 November 2004 from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm at the Pres. Diosdado Macapagal Hall, Land Bank of the Philippines, Ermita, Manila, the national convention is an activity in the 10 to 10 Governance Reforms Campaign-Festival which is being held from 10 October to 10 December 2004.

This memorandum circular hereby directs all heads of departments and agencies of the national government, including government-owned or controlled corporations with original charters to consider as official business the attendance of government officials in this convention.

Moreover, departments and agencies are authorized to disburse an amount of one thousand pesos (Php 1,000.00) as registration fee for every participant or representative of their respective agency.

This Memorandum Circular shall take effect immediately.
